

Rehearsal Expectations

- 1. Bring your script, pencil, eraser, and highlighter. They should be readily available.
- 2. School rules apply in the building. Absolutely no electronics.
 - a. If you are not needed on stage, please work on some homework, eat a snack, or watch quietly.
- 3. Absolutely no talking. Ever.
 - a. Talking distracts actors from the rehearsal process. It also slows everybody down. If you are talking, you may not hear me calling you.
- 4. We have a lot to do in not much time.
 - a. Memorize music, blocking, and choreography ASAP
 - b. I will teach it once and review it once. After that, it should be memorized.
- 5. What to do if you are late/miss a rehearsal you were called for:
 - a. Sign up to meet with Ms. Sella before school or during lunch to catch up on what you missed.

6. Conflicts:

- a. List of conflicts with the rehearsal schedule are due AT YOUR AUDITION
- b. Anything not listed on your conflict sheet will be considered an unexcused absence (with the exception of true emergencies, i.e. death and illness), subjecting you to dismissal from the show or disciplinary action from the school.
- c. This is a safety issue. We need to know where you are.

Please remember that Ms. Sella was in your shoes. She would not have created these rules/expectations if she did not believe they were necessary. We want this rehearsal process to go smoothly. If everybody does their part, we will have a great show.
