

Cast members are required to bring the following materials to every rehearsal.

> SCRIPTS

Scripts will be provided to all members of the cast at the first read-through and are for students to keep. Students are responsible for bringing their own script to rehearsals and bringing it home afterwards. The books belong to the children, so they are encouraged to write notes and highlight their individual parts in their scripts as well as in their music.

> A PENCIL, AN ERASER, AND A HIGHLIGHTER

Changes will be made to scripts and music throughout the course of rehearsals and cast members will be expected to take notes on lines and cues. We have a great deal to get done in a very limited amount of time, so every student should come with their own supplies.

> PATIENCE, A POSITIVE ATTITUDE, AND AN OPEN MIND

<u>PATIENCE</u> - On occasion, students will be called for a rehearsal in which they are not needed. The director will do his or her best to call only the students whose scenes are to be rehearsed for that day. However, there is no way to know exactly how long we will need for every scene. This is the nature of the theatre and your patience is essential to every rehearsal. Students are allowed and encouraged to bring school work to complete if they have down time. Students may not use cell phones during down time.

<u>A POSITIVE ATTITUDE</u> - Sometimes rehearsals can be challenging. Hard work pays off in the end. Think of the goal!

<u>AN OPEN MIND</u> - Be receptive to different or new ideas and to the opinions of others. Trust each other, trust me, and trust yourself.

> FUN

Above all, let's remember why we're all here! If at any time you feel like you're not having fun, please come and talk to the director. Her or she is here to make this production a success and if you're not enjoying yourself, the director not doing their job!
