## MRS. ARDILLO/MIDDLE SCHOOL LANGUAGE ARTS SUMMER 2019 READING ASSIGNMENTS Rising 7<sup>th</sup> Graders

Why read? Some people read for pleasure, some people read to experience new things. Some people read because reading will increase your vocabulary and reinforce the grammar and punctuation you learn in English class. A broader vocabulary and better grammar and punctuation will make you a better writer. Better writing skills will improve your grades in all subjects. So, the question really is "Why not read?"

There are two required books for 7<sup>th</sup> grade and one assignment for each. All assignments are due on the first day of school. The essay will be graded as "essay", weighted at 20%. The travel brochure will be graded as "homework", weighted at 10%. Rubrics for all summer work are attached and may be found on the school's website.

RISING 7<sup>TH</sup> GRADERS: You will be given a copy of The Wednesday Wars to use over the summer and in the fall as a class novel. You will have to purchase a copy of The Old Man and the Sea. You will need it in the fall as a class novel as well. If you use a library book to read one of these, you will have to check it out again when we study the book in class. You may purchase these books on your e-reader and use that at school when we discuss the books. There are also several very good used book stores in the Rockville/Silver Spring/Gaithersburg area where these books can usually be purchased for a very low price.

The Wednesday Wars by Gary D. Schmidt (272 pages)

ESSAY: Read the book, and then write a one-page, three-paragraph, **personal narrative** essay (**non-fiction, in first person**) about the school subject that would be your own "Wednesday War" instead of the Shakespeare lessons in the book. (Maybe you would feel that it would be "war" to have an extra period of a different subject on Wednesday instead of literature as does the character in the book. For me, I would write about how having an extra period of math would be my "Wednesday War".) This is not a book report or summary of the book; it is an essay based upon what school subject you would most hate to have an extra period of each Wednesday and why. This not a short story or a made-up story. You must select one REAL school subject from 6<sup>th</sup> grade to write about as your Wednesday War. Your paper must be typed with proper middle school heading and format. It should be written in first person. It should have a title, an introduction, one body paragraph, and a conclusion. Put the "word count" at the bottom of your last page on the left hand margin. For example: (325 words).

The Old Man and the Sea by Ernest Hemingway (approximately 127 pages)

DISPLAY: Make a travel brochure advertising Cuba as a tourist destination. Use a piece of white printer paper "landscape" (hotdog) and fold it like a brochure, a tri-fold brochure. This will give you six panels (front and back of the paper) to use for different aspects of visiting the island of Cuba: food, weather, religion, accommodations, culture or sports, etc. **Deep sea fishing must be featured on one of the panels of your brochure**. Include clip art, clippings from magazines or your own drawings to create your travel brochure. You must cite on the back of your brochure any copyrighted material that you "borrow" from the internet, both photos and text. Be creative! **These will be displayed in the hallway for Back to School Night in the fall.** For any written parts, you can write it neatly or type it on the computer, print it out and cut it to fit on your brochure. Be creative!
